When they had hearde the kynge/ they departed: a lo/  
 the starre whych they sawe in the East/ went befoꝛe thē/  
 vntill it came: & stode ouer the place where the chylde was.  
 When they sawe the starre/ they were maruelously glady  
 & went into the house/ & founde the chylde with Mary  
 hys mother/ \* & kneeled doꝛne/ & woꝛshipped hym/ & ope  
 ned theyꝛ treasures/ and offred vnto hym gyftes: gold/  
 fra:kyse and myꝛre. And after they were warned of God  
 in a dreame/ that they shulde not go agayne to Herode/  
 they returned to theyꝛ awne contre another waye. ¶
